The review will identify enhancements to inform and ensure continuous improvement in Queensland's disaster management arrangements.

The Office of the IGEM invites you to provide a submission if you, or those you know, have been involved with or impacted by a significant weather event during Queensland's 2023-24 Severe Weather Season.

The submissions process is open to individuals, departments, organisations, and community groups. We encourage you to share your stories and provide any information that may be relevant to the review.



## **Disaster Management Standard: accountabilities**

How familiar are you with the Disaster Management (DM) Standard in Queensland?

In this edition of IGEM Connect, we're highlighting the Standard's five key accountabilities that entities must establish to achieve specific outcomes. These accountabilities offer a structured approach to delivering outcomes as defined in the Standard.

The five accountabilities are:

- 1. Governance: Entities should manage their disaster responsibilities through clear decision-making, role identification, and outcome monitoring.
- 2. **Doctrine**: Disaster management is guided by relevant doctrine, encompassing strategies and principles that ensure compliance with legislation.
- 3. People: Success in disaster management depends on relationships, networks, and training. Entities should focus on network building and skill development.
- 4. Enablers: Resources such as equipment, systems, data, and technologies are crucial for disaster
- management. These resources should be fit for purpose and accessible. 5. **Continuous Improvement:** Entities should constantly monitor and improve their disaster management activities, driven by lessons learned, training methodologies, and insights from testing drive improvements.










# 2024 IGEM customer satisfaction survey
