2023-24 Severe Weather Season Review Update

As outlined in the April edition of IGEM Connect, the Office of the IGEM is conducting a review of the significant weather events relating to the 2023–24 Severe Weather Season.

The IGEM, along with review team members, has held 10 community forums across nine local government areas, with three more forums scheduled in early August. Each community forum has been incredibly insightful, with attendees openly sharing their experiences during the many significant weather events.

We are grateful for the support and services provided by Articulous, the Australian Red Cross and community recovery officers from the Department of Treaty, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships, Communities and the Arts and the Queensland Reconstruction Authority, who have provided support to community members at these forums. The review team has also held meetings with disaster management practitioners across local government, district disaster personnel and state government agencies.

If you have not made a submission, now is your chance. We want to hear from you. Submissions close at COB on 30 August 2024, with the final Review Report will be provided to our Minister by 29 September 2024. Your input is crucial in improving Queensland's disaster management.

2024 Local Disaster Management Plans Assessment process

The Office of the IGEM coordinates the annual Local Disaster Management Plan Assessment process in accordance

with Section 16C of the *Disaster Management Act 2003* (the Act). Local and District Disaster Management Groups have a legislated responsibility to review and assess their local disaster management plans under Section 59 and Section 23 of the Act respectively.

The 2024 State Disaster Management Plan Assessment process is out now. This year, the process requests went out in March 2024 through the Emergency Management Capability Command, QPS, to be filtered down from district to

local groups. The 2024 process is very similar to the 2023 process, with some minor changes to the questions asked. For example, "who is considered the primary audience for your disaster management plan?"

For 2024, each disaster management group are to provide their responses back to the Office of the IGEM by Friday 30 August 2024.

Research Advisory Panel

The recent Research Advisory Panel (RAP) meeting, chaired by the IGEM, was another terrific demonstration of the importance of collaboration, with strong participation both online and in person.

In addition to updates from the Office of the IGEM, we heard from the Queensland Disaster Research Alliance (QDRA). Comprising seven Queensland universities, the Alliance outlined its role and structure, emphasising efforts to build collaborative research teams for significant project bids. The QDRA aims to enhance Queensland's disaster management research capabilities, foster collaboration, and elevate the visibility of the state's research strengths.

Updates from Natural Hazards Research Australia outlined advancements in core research projects, including establishing a data management framework for effective hazard data sharing.
